Charming pieces for the left hand



Saint-Saëns' etudes for the left hand were written in 1912 at the request of his pianist friend Caroline Montigny-Rémaury de Serres, who had suffered an injury to her right hand. These etudes which were printed in 1913 were originally entitled "Petites pieces" by Saint-Saëns in his manuscript and indeed the cycle, which the composer himself described as "charming" and "amusing", lacks any rigour of an etude collection. Particularly the "Bourrée" quickly enjoyed great popularity.

The edition is based on the musical text from "Saint-Saëns – Œuvres instrumentales complètes", volume IV/3. An insightful Foreword (Fr/Eng/Ger) on the genesis and interpretation, a Critical Commentary (Eng) as well as an elegant music engraving make this collection of little gems the perfect addition to the piano repertoire.



Lullaby or compositional study?

Chopin's "Berceuse", composed in 1844, is one of his most frequently performed works and was regarded by subsequent composers as the prototype of the instrumental lullaby. This piece that Chopin initially named "Variantes" was composed around the time of his great Sonata in B minor op. 58 and was renamed "Berceuse" only when it went to print. In it, the composer systematically subjects a fourmeasure motif to a series of variants which are linked in a continuous flow over an ostinato figure.

This Urtext edition reflects the latest state of Chopin research, offering a definitive musical text based on all available sources. Readings and editorial decisions are documented in the Critical Commentary (Eng) and a detailed Foreword (Ger/Eng) provides information on the work. Hardy Rittner, a Chopin specialist as well as Professor of Piano at the Hochschule für Musik Freiburg, has supplemented the composer's fingering from a historically informed perspective. His chapter on performance practice contains valuable notes, particularly on Chopin's pedal indications which clearly diverge in the sources, as well as on tonal nuance, harmonic and melodic interplay, cantabilità and rubato.


Vingt-quatre Préludes pour le piano op. 28 / Prélude pour le piano op. 45

Hardly any cycle of piano pieces can match the magnetic attraction of Chopin's "24 Préludes", published in 1839. Schumann called them "sketches, beginnings of etudes, [...] ruins, stray eagle's pinions, all disorder and wild confusion".


Christoph Flamm has critically reevaluated the sources, bringing to light new readings of this well-known musical text. Hardy Rittner, who has recorded Brahms' piano music and all of Chopin's "Etudes" on period pianofortes, has supplemented Chopin's fingering from a historically informed perspective. He also provides valuable notes on performance practice, especially with regard to pedalling, rubato, latent polyphony, legato and Chopin's perception of sound.

Barcarolle pour piano in F-sharp major op. 60

In 1845/46 Chopin composed his bel canto inspired "Barcarolle" in F-sharp major op. 60, which became a model for subsequent generations of composers.

Songs without words in the French tradition



With this early cycle (1863/64), Fauré follows in the footsteps of Mendelssohn's "Lieder ohne Worte" (Songs without Words) whilst at the same time enrolling into the French tradition of the "Romance sans paroles" as penned by composers such as Thalberg, Kalkbrenner, Gounod or Bizet before him. It was not until 1880 that the pieces, the first of his piano works, appeared in print during the same year as the Ballade op. 19. The numerous reprints, transcriptions and arrangements during Fauré's lifetime testify to the great popularity of these works, which are also well-suited for piano lessons.

This Urtext edition takes all available sources into account, including the recording by Fauré himself and an early four-hand version of No. 3. It is based on the musical text of the "Œuvres complètes" of Gabriel Fauré and also contains the first version of the third "Romance sans paroles" in the appendix.

Third edition in the series "Terezín Composers"



The extraordinarily gifted composer and pianist Gideon Klein (1919–1945) was murdered in the Fürstengrube concentration camp at the age of 25. One of the undeniable highlights of his small compositional legacy is his Sonata for Piano. Its three movements were written in reverse order in the Terezín concentration camp in 1943; only a three-measure draft of the intended fourth movement has survived.

This first Urtext edition of the piano sonata has been expanded to include the previously unpublished short melodrama "Landscape" (entitled "Topol" / "Poplar" in existing literature) in which the pianist can also take over the recitation part if required. In July 1939, shortly after Klein completed his studies at the conservatory, he composed this setting of the same-named poem by Vilém Závada (1905–1982) in the style of free atonality.

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





Ševčík for violoncello



Ševčík's opus 3 which concentrates mainly on the use of the bouncing bow in violin playing, builds on the systematic development of bowing technique which the composer had already focused on in his previous opus 2 – School of Bowing Technique. In a compact and highly effective form, the "Forty Variations" cover a wide sequence of movements for the right arm ranging from elementary to virtuosic.

In his arrangement for violoncello, Tomáš Jamník stays true to Ševčík's methodical intention by not mechanically transposing the original violin version, but rather ensuring an adequate adaptation to the positions of the violoncello. Thus, these short variations now become a valuable pedagogical work for cellists while also serving as virtuosic compositions for concert performances.

From the Golden Age ...



The second half of the 19th century represented something of a 'Golden Age' of the violin sonata in France: Influential violin sonatas such as those by Franck, Fauré or Saint-Saëns were among the successful works of this genre, inspiring many further compositions.


Saint-Saëns' Violin Sonata no. 1 was incorporated into the repertoire of numerous late 19th-century violinists soon after it was written. It was also this sonata that inspired Marcel Proust when he wrote about the fictional sonata by the composer Vinteuil in his novel "À la recherche du temps perdu".

This performing edition edited by Fabien Guilloux and François de Médicis is based on the musical text from "Saint-Saëns – Œuvres instrumentales complètes", volume III/4 in which Saint-Saëns' lengthy corrections of the Durand first edition as well as the autograph sources have been meticulously evaluated.





... of the violin sonata



Saint-Saëns' Violin Sonata no. 2 was written in 1896 during a stay of several months by the composer in Egypt: he began the main themes of all four movements as well as the canonic trio in Luxor and Aswan. The sonata was then completed on the Nile journey back to Cairo. That same year the sonata was premiered by Saint-Saëns and Pablo Sarasate in a concert celebrating the composer's fiftieth stage anniversary. Astoundingly, he had first appeared on stage when he was only ten years old.

This performing edition edited by Fabien Guilloux and François de Médicis is based on "Saint-Saëns – Œuvres instrumentales complètes", volume III/4. It reflects the most up-to-date state of research on this work which the edition presents in a spacious engraving.

A worthy "opus 1"



Artaria had already published variations on a Mozart aria by Beethoven in 1793 under the highly symbolic opus number 1. However, the composer was not satisfied with this work and ensured that the opus number was transferred to another group of works which appeared in 1795, the three Piano Trios op. 1. His hope that these compositions would be worthy of his "opus 1" and would make quite some impression was to be fulfilled.

In many aspects of the trios the compositional influence of Haydn on Beethoven can be found. However, ultimately it will have been the innovative elements that astonished and delighted the audience of early Vienna: the virtuosity and scope of the unusually large-scale works, the unprecedented extended coda of the outer movements, the radicality of the dynamic contrasts and the introduction of remote keys as a means of musical expression.


In order to clarify some unclear readings, the editor and Beethoven specialist Jonathan Del Mar consulted Beethoven's markings in his op. 104 (an arrangement of the Trio op. 1, no. 3) – a source that has not been taken into consideration in any previous edition of this trio.

... of the St. John Passion

Unlike Bach's other oratorio compositions, there is no definitive version of the St. John Passion. The first version of 1724 which is today's standard version represents a mixture of different readings but it was not performed like this in Bach's day. On the other hand, the second version of 1725 was performed under the direction of Bach himself and can therefore be considered authentic. In addition to a change in order of several movements, the second version differs from the earlier version by the use of the opening chorus "O Mensch, bewein".

The performance material corresponds to the Urtext edition of Version II which was recently published as part of the "New Bach Edition – Revised" (NBA^{rev}).





"Songs I" contains Dvořák's first song compositions written from 1865 to 1882. This edition brings the project, which stretched over several years to publish Urtext editions of all the composer's works for solo voice and piano, to a close.

Lesser-known songs by the young Dvořák are also included in this volume, of which the "Two Songs for Baritone" from the year 1865 appear here for the first time. The composer wrote these only a few months after "Cypresses", his first work in this genre. Eleven songs of the cycle "Evening Songs" were published by various publishers during the composer's lifetime; the ultimate song "Like the Moon in the Vault of Heaven" has not survived in its entirety and therefore appears in the appendix. In his early songs, the composer set not only texts by the leading Czech poets of his time to music, but also folk poetry.
